As PathFinders enters its 9th year, we continue to ensure that every child born in Hong Kong has a fair start in life. 2016 was PathFinders' busiest year ever - we supported 900 new babies and women. We have now helped over 4,500 of Hong Kong's most vulnerable people. The babies' mothers are typically current or former foreign domestic workers and almost 90% of their fathers are in Hong Kong. I'd like to share one of our cases with you:

A 7-day-old baby, Rohit, was brought to PathFinders with a serious infection. During a particularly cold winter, and denied access to public healthcare, Rohit and his mother had been sleeping homeless in a park. Rohit had no legal identity; nothing to prove he even existed. PathFinders provided health care, immunisations, shelter, food, clothing and, critically, helped Rohit obtain identity documentation. With intensive one-on-one care and counselling, Rohit and his mother are now on their way to a much brighter, more stable future.

Longer term, the welfare and success of family units such as Rohit's depend on Hong Kong's legal, policy, and welfare safety nets catching and providing for them. For this reason, and because of our unsustainably high caseload, 2016 saw us amplify our interventions at Legislative Council, government, consular, agency and United Nations' levels. We spoke at corporate and academic institutions, contributed chapters to law books and, as a last resort, helped this largely voiceless community assert their legal rights with considerable success.

We also welcomed Judy Chan, Lara Fabregas and Kestity Pringgoharjono as board directors.

We could not do our work without significant support. Thank you for all that you do to help Hong Kong's most vulnerable babies and their migrant mothers.

踏入成立至今的第九個年頭，PathFinders繼續堅守其使命，確保每位於香港出生的孩子得到公平合理的對待，助他們踏出人生第一步。

PathFinders於2016年支援了共900名嬰孩及婦女，是我們前所未有的最忙碌的一年。成立至今，我們已協助了超過4,500名這些香港最無助的人士。接受我們支援的嬰孩，他們的母親主要為現任或曾經受聘於為香港家庭的外傭；而他們的父親，超過九成為居港人士。且讓我跟你們分享一個個案：

這個故事的主角是小Rohit，他被送到PathFinders時只有7天大而且身體受到嚴重感染。一個特別寒冷的冬日，小Rohit的媽媽知道快要生產了，但因被拒於公共醫療設施之外，她最終只好獨自在公園誕下了小Rohit。母子倆在寒冬中無家可歸。小Rohit不單欠缺法定身份，甚至連可證實他存在的證據也沒有。PathFinders除了為小Rohit提供醫療、免疫接種、庇護、食物、衣服等基本需求以外，更重要的是助他取得身份證明文件。經過深切的一對一照料及輔導，小Rohit及媽媽終可得見曙光，展望一個較為安穩的未來。

對於小Rohit及其他身處類似處境的人士及家庭，他們的福祉，長遠來說是須依靠香港於法律、政策及福利三方面為他們築起安全網，以提供所須的保障及支援。鑑於這個原因及考慮到服務量持續高企於難以應付的水平，我們於2016年加強了於立法會、領事館、政府部門及聯合國等各層面上的介入質詢工作。此外，我們也在企業及學術機構做出演說、為法律書籍貢獻文章及在別無他選的情況下，替社會上這無聲的一群，作出法律上的抗爭並取得相當理想的成績。

我們同時很高興邀得陳芳女士、Lara Fabregas及 Kestity Pringgoharjono出任董事局成員，在此歡迎她們加盟。

最後，我衷心感謝每位支持者對香港最無助、最脆弱的孩子及外傭母親們所作出的貢獻和努力。是你們那份無私施予及慷慨襄助，賦予我們繼續前行的動力，造就我們今天的成績。

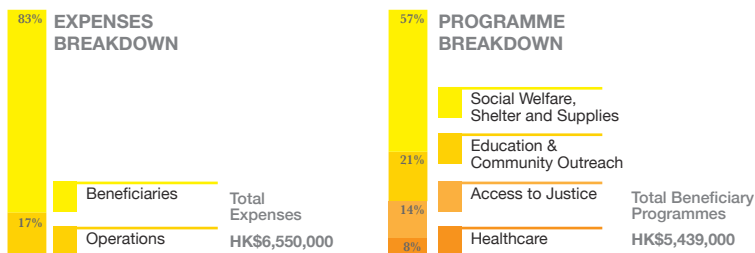

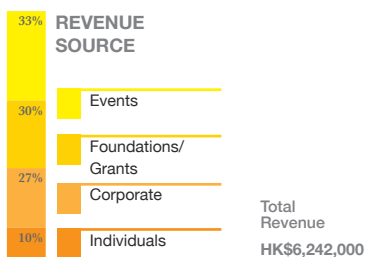

PathFinders Limited is an independent, secular and non-partisan humanitarian services and organisation with tax-exempt charitable status in Hong Kong. Since our founding in 2008, PathFinders has helped over 4,500 of Hong Kong's most vulnerable babies, children and migrant women. Over 10% of these children would, but for PathFinders, have been at extreme risk of abuse, neglect, even trafficking.

MISSION

To ensure that the most vulnerable children born in Hong Kong, and their migrant mothers, are respected and protected.

PathFinders believes that every child deserves a fair start in life. Our approach is:

WHY DOES HONG KONG NEED PATHFINDERS?

The babies, children and women we help are either not supported, or are inadequately supported, by Hong Kong's existing public welfare, healthcare and access to justice structures. In effect, they fall through the cracks of our otherwise world class social welfare safety nets.

WHO DOES PATHFINDERS HELP?

PathFinders helps pregnant, migrant women (principally current or former foreign domestic workers) in distress and their Hong Kong-born children. Despite legal protections, too many of these women are unlawfully fired once their pregnancy is announced or discovered. In 2016, 88% of the fathers were in Hong Kong. Once their employment is terminated, these pregnant women immediately become homeless. Within two weeks they lose access to all public welfare support. Now destitute, they and their babies are among the most vulnerable and underserved people in Hong Kong.

APPROACH





Our key activities focus on filling the public service gaps in social welfare and support, healthcare, education and access to justice. We ensure that the standard of service and care given, where possible, match those of Hong Kong's public welfare system. We address all humanitarian needs from ensuring the child is documented to the end of the particular crisis, typically:

- For a woman: from a pregnancy right through to when the woman and child find their path to a sustainable and legal future; and
- For a baby/child: from ensuring all children are documented and immunised to placing an abandoned/neglected child in a safe, permanent and loving family.

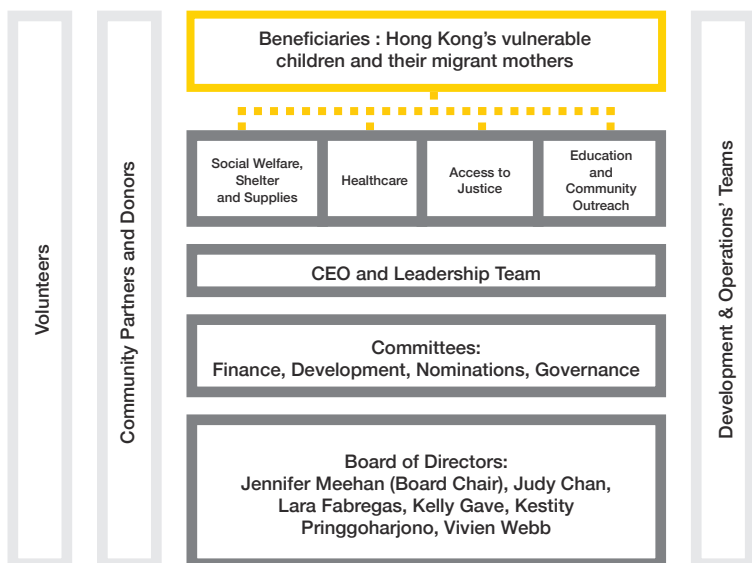

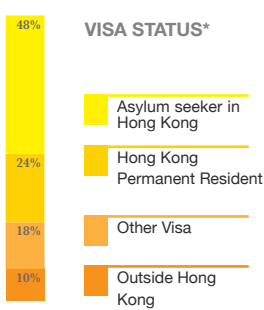
TOP 6 EMPLOYER DISTRICTS*



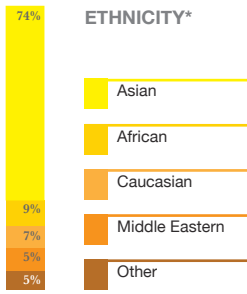

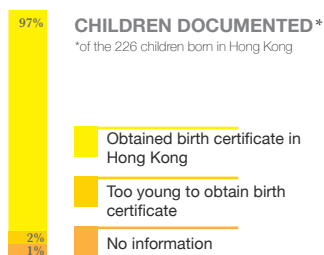
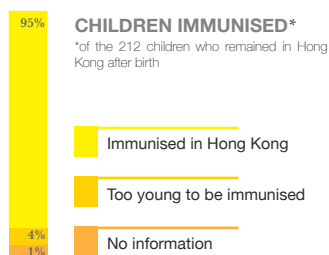
PathFinders' social workers support each family unit, ensuring that mothers have the critical information they need to address immigration, medical, legal, employment, emotional and security issues. For abandoned and vulnerable children, our child care specialists work to ensure that they are protected and placed in a loving and stable family environment as quickly as possible.

ACTIONS

1. Provide shelter, food, clothing, nappies, bedding to meet basic human needs
2. Ensure that undocumented babies and children are registered and obtain birth certificates and passports
3. Intervene to protect children against abuse, neglect, and abandonment
4. Provide medical support
5. Provide counselling, comfort and care
6. For mothers who decide that adoption is the best option for the child, refer to adoption services

Healthcare

醫療服務

NEED

Foreign domestic workers who are illegally fired or forced to resign because they are pregnant, lose access to all public welfare and health care in Hong Kong within two weeks of their employment being terminated. This group of mothers and their babies are desperately in need of health care, health system navigation and health education. For those women who are still employed, help is needed with health care access, navigation and tailored, language-specific advice.

RESPONSE

PathFinders' Health Care team provides access to vital medical services and bridges health care and service gaps. We endeavour to detect and prevent pregnancy complications, to promote safe pregnancy and childbirth and to provide baby care information. PathFinders' interventions increase the likelihood of a healthy birth and a healthy baby.

ACTIONS

1. Provide maternity advice, pre-natal and post-natal care
2. Facilitate access to quality medical services by partnering with pro-bono doctors, nurses and clinics
3. Accompany women to receive family planning advice and support
4. Educate mothers about pregnancy and baby care through workshops and one-on-one counseling
5. Conduct home-based check-ups after the baby is born, to support new mothers and babies

Access to Justice

法律及公義

NEED

Foreign domestic workers often struggle to understand and enforce their legal rights in Hong Kong. Language and cultural barriers, lack of knowledge and gaps in the access to justice system pose significant impediments. Employed women are entitled to maternity protections. Babies whose biological fathers have disappeared have paternity and maintenance rights.

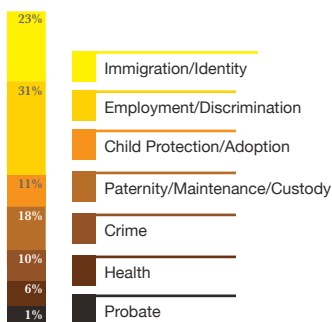
RESPONSE

PathFinders' legal team ensures that vulnerable babies, children and women receive quality legal advice and representation in a language they understand. We bridge a significant access to justice gap by identifying legal issues, finding lawyers to help and then supporting the women and children through the legal process and when appearing in courts and tribunals. Our guiding principle is that everyone should have equal access to, and is equal before, the law.

ACTIONS

1. Identify and prepare legal cases
2. Partner with pro-bono lawyers to pursue claims
3. Assist and accompany clients to navigate the justice system
4. Educate mothers about their legal rights and obligations
5. Provide lawyers, law students, academics, interns and volunteers with street law experience

PathFinders' innovative and highly collaborative access to justice work not only helps the vulnerable and otherwise voiceless children and women PathFinders serves, it also enables Hong Kong's lawyers to serve society through important pro bono work.

IN 2016

FIRST SEX DISCRIMINATION CASE

The first Sex Discrimination case brought in Hong Kong by a domestic worker was heard in the District Court.

NEGOTIATED REINSTATEMENT

Working with PathFinders, pro bono lawyers negotiated reinstatement of two clients unlawfully dismissed by their employers when pregnant.

COMPENSATION

Through out-of-court settlement, HK\$752,538 was recovered in damages and compensation by four clients wrongfully dismissed by their employers when they were pregnant.

DAVID CLARKE FELLOWSHIP

Won the David Clarke Hong Kong Fellowship which provides PathFinders' CEO with the opportunity to visit access to justice models around the world.

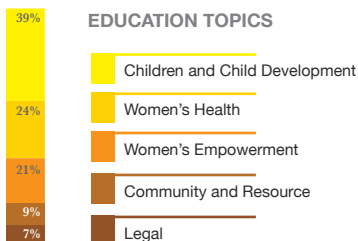
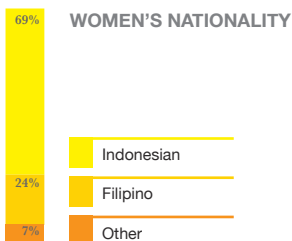
NEED

PathFinders estimates that there may be as many as 6,000 vulnerable pregnant, migrant women. The number rises as more foreign domestic workers enter our workforce. Most women emigrate from developing nations with little to no knowledge about reproductive health, rights and services, and they critically need education.

RESPONSE

PathFinders' teams increase migrant women's understanding of reproductive health and related topics. We give culturally- and linguistically-tailored information on their weekly day off in the places where they gather. This leads to heightened awareness and increased knowledge about maternity rights and the rights of vulnerable children. We also educate the broader community of employers and employment agencies, as well as government, legislative, consular and statutory bodies. We work to increase awareness of the absence of government policy regarding how best to manage the pregnancy of a foreign domestic worker.

SCOPE



In 2016, PathFinders received a certificate of nomination of the Hassan Wirajuda Citizen Protection Award 2016 from the Government of the Republic of Indonesia. This certificate is an appreciation of the exemplary work of Pathfinders to provide protection and education for mothers and children. PathFinders is a close and cooperative partner of the Consulate General.

1. Host booths in parks and public gathering spaces to disseminate information
2. Contribute regular feature & opinion pieces in Hong Kong's main domestic worker media outlets
3. Provide support for families returning to the mother's home country through pre-departure preparation classes, in-country care, counselling & financial assistance
4. Collaborate with consulates, policy makers, academics, law schools, NGOs, international agencies & governments to identify & address systemic gaps & root causes giving rise to the extreme vulnerabilities of the women & children we help

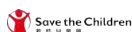
